# KCR proposes four-lane road leading to Yadagirigutta

HYDERABAD: Chief minister K Chandrasekhar Rao announced that the state government would earmark Rs 100 crore every year for developing Yadagirigutta as a major religious centre.

Chandrasekhar Rao, along with architects Raj and Jagan, temple architect Anand Sai, and Sthapathi Soundar Rajan and chief of Yadagirigutta Urban Development Authority G Kishan Rao, conducted an aerial survey of the temple surroundings on Wednesday.

After performing a puja, he went around the temple for about 40 minutes and later held a review meeting with architects and temple authorities on the development of the temple.

KCR said that the temple should be developed as per the rules of Agama Sastra and said that Sri China Jeeyar Swamy's advice would be taken into consideration while developing the temple surroundings.

The chief minister also directed roads and buildings officials to develop a four-lane road from Raigiri to Yadagirigutta and improve roads in the surrounding villages of Vangapally, Turkapally, Raigiri and Rajapeta.

KCR favoured planting of flower-bearing plants along the roads and installation of music system to play devotional hymns all along the way to the temple. He announced that both Raigiri and Yadagirigutta would be developed under Mission Kakatiya.

While rejecting the proposal to construct a helipad on the gutta, KCR advised officials to utilise 14.5 acres near the temple for construction of mada veedhi, kalyana mantapam, pravachana shala, cottages and a parking lot.

KCR also hoped that apart from the state government's financial allocations, sponsors and private institutions would come forward for the development of Yadagirigutta.
